

• Learning outcome- The aim of the conference is to draw attention to the original culture and understanding its religious, cultural and social influences on their lives.



Concept Note

The history of Drama is as old as the existence of human beings on this earth. In most of the ancient cultures. Drama has an indigenous religious origin. The seminal roots of Indian Drama may be traced to the Vedic era. It is believed that the basic elements of Indian Drama- text (plot), music, acting and rasa were educed from the Rig Veda, the Sama Veda, the Yajur Veda and the Atharva Veda respectively. Harmonizing these constituents judiciously, Bharat Muni compiled a voluminous treatise named 'Natyashastra', which is the oldest and the most authenticated text on Indian Drama. This monumental discourse is honoured as 'Natya Veda' or 'Pancham Veda' too. Bhasa, Shudrak, Kalidasa, Bhavabhuti and King Harshavardhana are some of the esteemed Sanskrit dramatists. Sanskrit Drama has a very long and rich history of theatrical treatise.

Modern Indian Drama came the limelight in the 19th century during the British colonial rule. Parsi Theatrical troupes played a prominent role in reshaping and popularizing Modern Drama. They amalgamated European theatrical techniques and local folk forms of Indian Drama and thus created a hybrid theatre. Rakesh, Badal Sirkar, Vijav Tendulkar, Girish Karnad, Bharati Sarabhai, Deena Mehta, Manjula Padmanabham, Poile Sengupta are some of the pioneers of modern Indian Drama.


