CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

Admission:

- After admission, if a student is found to have submitted false documents/given false information / deliberately hiding important facts, then her admission can be terminated.
- If a student leaves the college in mid-session or is terminated in mid-session, fees paid shall not be refunded

Attendance:

- Students are expected to attend lectures punctually as the attendance is registered separately for each class.
- Attendance during examinations is compulsory.
- Moreover, 75% attendance in every subject is a must. Defaulters will not be allowed to appear for the End Semester Examinations.
- When absenting from class, the leave record in the diary duly signed by the Parent should be submitted to the Principal on the day of return.
- Students going for sports/NCC/NSS/cultural competition /extra-curricular activities/seminars as on duty should get prior permission from the Principal through the Faculty- in-charge of these programmes.
- In case of prolonged absence on account of medical reasons; a medical certificate ought to be submitted to the Principal within ten days of absence.

Discipline:

- Every student shall maintain the decorum of the College and be polite to the Principal, Vice-Principal, the Teaching, Non-teaching and Maintenance Staff and also to their peers.
- No student is allowed to leave the lecture hall without the Lecturer's permission or until the class is dismissed.
- There should be complete silence on the corridors during class

hours. Students must not loiter in the corridors during class hours.

- Students are liable to disciplinary action (even dismissal) if found smoking in and around the campus, in possession of, or under the influence of tobacco products, drugs or alcohol.
- Insubordination, habitual inattention, neglect of work, unbecoming language or conduct, obscenity in word or deed render a student liable to temporary or permanent dismissal.
- Students are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and maturity. They must observe norms of decency and propriety.
- Though the College is not responsible for the conduct of its students outside the premises, it will take note of any serious misconduct of students outside the campus.
- Outsiders are not permitted to attend college functions. Strict action will be taken against those who bring outsiders to the campus.
- Posters, Banners, Flags, Pamphlets, Leaflets and notices must not be put up without the permission & signature of the Principal.
- Printed matter, photographs/videos not approved by the Principal are not to be brought to the College.
- The campus must be kept clean at all times. Littering, defacing the walls or desks, damaging College property etc. are offences. Every class under the guidance of the class representative will be responsible for the cleanliness of the room allotted to it.
- Identified students/ whole class / batch will be punished, if any property of the college is damaged.
- Vehicle Parking will be allowed on all working days from 8:00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. The College will not take responsibility of vehicles parked in the premises after 4:00 p.m.

- No money is to be collected from students without the prior permission of the Principal.
- If students have any difficulty that needs to be addressed they can put it through their representative in a disciplined and peaceful manner to the teacher, if very necessary to the Principal. They can also contact their mentor teacher or the Grievance Redressal Cell. However, they cannot by any means contact any outsiders.
- Students shall not indulge in any political activity on the college campus. Violence of any kind shall not be tolerated.
- Students shall not involve in any immoral/criminal activity. In case of any such involvement, strict action shall be taken.
- After class hours students are not expected to remain on the campus unless there is a function/programme or rehearsal or games practice.
- Students must cultivate the use of the Library. They are expected to spend their free time in the Library or in the reading room where they can refer to books, magazines, newspapers, journals and e-resources.

Punctuality: Students must observe Punctuality. If a student is regularly late for classes, she may not be permitted to attend classes. If the concerned lecturer is absent, students are expected to go to the library, e- resource laboratory or re-arrange the class.

Daily assembly: It is mandatory for all the students to attend the daily assembly. All important information is disseminated at the assembly.

Identity cards: Students must wear their identity cards issued by the college at all times in the campus. In the absence of ID-Cards, students shall not be permitted to enter the college, or participate in any college function nor will be allowed to issue library books. In case of loss of original identity card a duplicate will be provided on payment.

Dress code: There is no specific dress code as such but students are expected to dress decently inside the campus.

Mobile phones: Use of Mobile Phones on the Campus is strictly for educational purpose only.

Payment of exam fees: The students shall pay the examination fees for every semester to enable them to write the semester examinations. A notification will be issued for this purpose in each semester. Those students who fail to pay examination fees within the stipulated time will be given a chance to pay a fine at the rate equivalent to the term fee fine. Those students who fail to pay examination fees will not be permitted to appear for semester examinations. However, the Controller of Examinations may permit such candidates with extra fine, subject to the convenience of conducting the examinations. All students who are currently on roll shall pay the examination fees compulsorily.

EXAMINATION

- **No Dues Certificate:** All those candidates who appear for the examinations shall obtain a No Dues Certificate from the Department, Hostel, Library, Physical Director and the laboratory concerned.
- **Hall Tickets:** All those candidates who appear for the examinations shall be issued hall tickets only when they produce "No Dues Certificate" from the various offices as mentioned above. No candidate will be permitted to appear for semester examinations without the hall ticket.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR EXAMINATION:

- Candidates should be present in the examination hall 30 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- Candidates should carefully note the date, time and title of the paper to be held on each day. They shall take the allotted places in the examination hall at least 30 minutes before the time fixed for the commencement of the examination.

- Candidates are not permitted to bring electronic watches with memory, laptop computers, personal systems, paging devices, mobile phones, cameras, recording systems or any other gadget / device / object that would, in the opinion of the invigilator, be of unfair assistance to the candidate.
- Candidates should search their pockets, desks and benches and hand over to the Invigilator, any paper, book or note book which they may find therein, before starting to answer the paper.
- Candidates who are suffering from infectious diseases will not be admitted into the examination hall but may be allowed to write the examination in a separate place.
- The candidates will not be allowed to leave the examination hall/ room till the expiry of time prescribed by the invigilator after the distribution of question papers. Similarly no candidate will be permitted inside the examination hall after the expiry of thirty minutes from the commencement of examinations.
- Any candidate found guilty of deliberate and premeditated arrangement with the intention to indulge in malpractices in the examination such as possessing unauthorized answer book, impersonation or any other misconduct of a serious nature will be punished severely

A candidate found guilty of malpractice in the examination hall shall be sent out by the concerned authorities and such a candidate shall not be permitted to appear for the papers / practical and viva examination of that examination for which the candidate has registered, till the appropriate authority clears her.

ANTI RAGGING POLICY

Ragging is a criminal offence as per the Supreme Court verdict.

Sophia Girls' College (Autonomous), Ajmer is known for its discipline and moral values. The Institution has zero tolerance towards anything that goes against and degrades these values.

Ragging is against the human and ethical values which our institution upholds

Ragging consists of one or more of the following acts:

- Any conduct by any student whether by words spoken, written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, and handling with offensiveness a fresher or any other student.
- Engaging in improper activities by any student or students which causes annoyance, hardship, physical/psychological harm, or to raise fear, apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- Any action by a senior student that prevents disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving wrong pleasure, distorted or a callous thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to a fresher or any other student
- Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or imposing superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
- Asking any student to do any act which the student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or producing a sense of humiliation, or distress or agony so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks allotted to an individual or a group of students.
- Any act of financial blackmail or forceful expenditure put on a fresher or any other student by the students.

Ragging in any form is totally banned in the entire Institution and strict action is taken against those found guilty of ragging. All complaints pertaining to any kind of ragging by any student/group of students of the College inside or outside the College campus may be reported to the Anti-Ragging and Vigilance Committee by sending a mail to **antiraggingcell@sophia.college** or putting a slip in the Grievance Box. The students may also fill the online Grievance Form when in need. They may also approach the members of the Committee or their mentors as per their comfort level. Anti Ragging Measures:

In conformity with the Supreme Court judgments and directions, UGC Guidelines and State Government Instructions, our College follows a 'Zero-Tolerance Policy' towards ragging. Any student of Sophia Girls College (Autonomous),Ajmer if accused and found guilty of ragging, will be severely dealt with as per the College's Policy against Ragging.

The Institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging by:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any international, national or regional meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/Expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Expulsion from the Institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other Institution for a specified period

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The CBCS provides a convenient and effective teaching-learning platform where in the student has an opportunity to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill based courses. The courses are evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. This benefits the students when they move across institutions within India and across countries. The uniform grading system is also beneficial to potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates.

Advantages of the choice based credit system:

- Shift in focus from teacher-centric to student-centric education.
- Students may undertake as many credits as they can cope with.
- CBCS allows students to choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary courses, skill oriented papers (even from other disciplines according to their learning needs, interests and aptitude) and gives more flexibility for students.
- CBCS makes education broad-based and at par with global standards.

Credit System:

A 'credit' is generally a 'value' used to measure a student's work load in terms of learning time required to complete course units, resulting in learning outcomes. The total credits to be earned by an U.G. and P.G. student for Graduation and Post Graduation is given in the syllabus.

All U.G. and P.G. Programmes under Autonomous System follow Choice Based Credit System.

OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM FOR UG PROGRAMMES:

1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

1.1 Discipline Specific Core Course (DSCC)

1.2 Discipline Specific Core Project/ Practical (DSCL)

2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses.

2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course or Project:
Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

2.2 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses are based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

**3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):
(6 Credits)**

- AECC - I - (Semester -I) - General English - **2 Credits**
- AECC- II -(Semester -II) - Life of Philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi **2 Credits**
- AECC - III - (Semester -II) - General Hindi / Elementary Hindi (For non-Hindi Speaking Students) **2 Credits**
- AECC- IV- (Semester -III) - Environmental Studies **2 Credits**

3.2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (Semester -IV & V): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc. It is a 2 credit course and the total duration will be 30 hours.

4. Non-CGPA Credit Courses (NCCC): These courses are co-curricular and extra-curricular activity based courses. It is mandatory that an UG student earns 4 credits through NCCC. It comprises of:

4.1 Life Skills Education (LSE) - 2 Credits (Semester -I & II) Students earn 2 credits through LSE during first and second semester.

(Health & Well Being Courses - Basic Yoga, Basic Swimming Techniques, Aerobics, Gym Fitness, Self Defense)

4.2 Extra-curricular & Extension Activities (EEA) - 2 Credits (Maximum 4 credits) (From Semester -I-V)

In addition, all students should take part in extension/extra-curricular activities (NCC, NSS, Sports & Games, Outreach, Research Initiatives, Exchange Programs, Entrepreneurship Programs, Specified extra-curricular activities, Internships, Certified Course Completion from MOOCs / Swayam / NPTEL etc.) in order to earn two credits as part of Extra-curricular and

4. Non-CGPA Credit Courses (NCCC): These courses are co-curricular and extra-curricular activity based courses. It is mandatory that a PG student earns 2 credits through NCCC. It comprises of:

- **Extra-curricular & Extension Activities (EEA) - 2 Credits** (Maximum 4 credits)

In addition, all students should take part in extension/extra-curricular activities (NCC, NSS, Sports & Games Outreach, Research Initiatives, Exchange Programs, Entrepreneurship Programs, specified extra-curricular activities, Sports, Cultural activities, Internships, Certified Course Completion from MOOCs/ Swayam / NPTEL etc.) in order to earn two credits as part of Extra-curricular and Extension Credits.

POLICY OF THE COLLEGE FOR AWARDING CREDITS FOR NON-CGPA CREDIT COURSES (NCCC):

To encourage undergraduate students to participate in extracurricular and co-curricular activities, credits are allotted. Each student must compulsorily earn 2 credits and may earn 2 additional credits. The distribution of credits under different categories is as follows:

1. SPORTS AND GAMES:

Students who are participating in sports and games as members of the College team can get 2 credits per year for 60 hours of practice /training as recorded. For every additional 60 hours of training, these students shall get 1 additional credit. Students get 2 credits for every win whether 1st, 2nd or 3rd in the inter-collegiate competitions. For every subsequent win (only 1st), a student can get 1 credit.

- Students playing for the MDS University, Ajmer can get 2 additional credits
- Students playing for the Rajasthan state can get 3 additional credits
- Students playing in the National teams can get 4 credits.

Note: Students are expected to participate regularly in practice and training to obtain any additional credit for the above.

All these credits must be approved by the Sports Director and scrutinized by the committee constituted by the Principal.

2. PARTICIPATION IN CULTURAL EVENTS

Note: Students are expected to participate regularly in practice and training to obtain any additional credit for the following:

- Dance / Music / Theatre / Choir - For 60 hours of training and practice, students of the College team can get 2 credits
- 2 credits for every win whether 1st, 2nd or 3rd in the Inter-

Collegiate Competitions For every subsequent win (only 1st), a student can get 1 credit.

All these credits must be approved by the Coordinator in charge of cultural activities and scrutinized by the committee constituted by the Principal.

3. OUTREACH PROGRAMME / NSS / OTHER SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITY

- For 60 hours of involvement, students get 2 credits
- 2 additional credits for exceptional active involvement for an additional 60 hours
- 2 credits for a ten days work camp

All these credits must be approved by the Coordinator of the respective activity.

4. NCC

- 2 credits for 60 hours of training / parade / other activities
- For an additional 60 hours more, students can get 1 additional credit
- For RD/other such events, students can get an additional 2 credits
- For multiples of the above, students get 1 additional credit
- 1 extra credit for passing B / C / other such Certificate examination.

All these credits must be approved by the NCC officer.

5. EXTRA-ACADEMIC / ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES/ RESEARCH ACTIVITIES

All extra credit claims under this heading, will require sufficient academic input/contribution from students concerned.

- 2 credits for one academic seminar Paper /PPT presentations / paper reading
- 2 credits for publication in journals/ magazines/ compilations

- An additional one credit for every subsequent activity of the above.
- 2 credits for participating in two International / National / State level Seminars / Workshops / Conferences etc
- 2 credits for measureable Research Work undertaken and Field trips amounting to 30 hours of recorded work.
- 2 credits for creating models in exhibitions / other exhibits.
- 2 credits for any voluntary social service / Nation building exercise which is equivalent to 30 hours

All these credits must be approved by HODs of the respective Departments.

6. ENTREPRENEURSHIP PROGRAM :

Students who have a Start-up / Online Business and have registered with the Institution Innovation Council of the College and have over 30 hours of recorded work can earn 2 credits.

These credits must be approved by the Coordinator of Institution Innovation Council of the College

7. INTERNSHIPS:

Students, who participate in summer projects / training / Internships in institutions of repute through a proper selection process, will get 2 credits for each such activity.

This credit must be approved by the HODs of the respective Department.

8. EXCHANGE ACTIVITIES:

Students who are part of the MOU Student Exchange Activities and have over 30 hours of recorded work, can earn 2 credits

This credit must be approved by the HODs of the respective Departments.

9. CERTIFIED COURSE COMPLETION FROM MOOCS/SWAYAM/NPTEL etc.

Students who undertake Certified Course's from MOOCs / Swayam / NPTEL/ National or International Certification Courses etc. and have over 30 hours of recorded work can earn 2 credits on submitting the Course Completion Certificate.

This credit must be approved by the HODs of the respective Department.

10. CERTIFICATE COURSE:

- Students can get additional credits (number of credits will depend on the course duration) from certificate courses offered by the College. The student must successfully complete the course.
- These credits must be approved by the Course Coordinators.
- There are no credits for organizing or for serving as office bearers or volunteers for Inter-Class / Associations / Sports / Social Service, activities. The Office Bearers and volunteers are given a letter of appreciation by the College.
- All claims for the credit should be approved by the mentor within a fortnight of completing the activity and must be submitted in the prescribed format available in the office of the COE, in the first week of March, of the academic year

EVALUATION SYSTEM

I Evaluation System.

Evaluation for Semester based programmes shall be done through Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and End Semester Examination (ESE). The weightage for the two types of evaluation is given below:

CIA	ESE	Total
30%	70%	100%

II Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA):

The CIA is based on one exam, assignments, projects, presentations, class performance and attendance. The student is compulsorily expected to participate in all of the above. In case the student is unable to attend the exam due to some grave reason she should submit an application to the Principal in writing within one week of the exam and obtain permission to appear in the Mercy Examination. There will be no Due Exam for CIA.

III Criteria for Passing the Semester:

1. Examinations will be conducted for odd and even semesters at the end of each semester.
2. A student is required to score a minimum of 40% marks in a paper (CIA+ESE put together). In case of subjects with practical paper, it is mandatory for the student to score 40% marks in the practical examination to be declared to have passed in that paper. If the student falls in theory or practical she should reappear for theory or practical examination as the case may be.
3. If a student does not secure minimum marks in theory paper but clears the practical exam of that paper, then practical marks will be carried forward.
4. A candidate is deemed to have failed in a theory / practical paper if the above conditions are not fulfilled.
5. A candidate is considered to have passed the semester if she has cleared all the papers and obtained a minimum of 40% of the total marks in that semester.
6. For Non CGPA Courses a student has to appear in the exam and earn the required credits in order to clear the Semester.

IV Criteria for Completion of UG/PG Programmes:

All students of undergraduate programmes must:

1. Pass all examinations and other academic requirements as per the proposed syllabi.

2. Pass the prescribed Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses, Non-CGPA Credit Courses (NCCC)- Life Skills Education (LSE), Extra-curricular & Extension Activities (EEA) as instructed in the syllabus.

V Promotion Policy for UG Programmes:

1. A student of Semester-I & III shall automatically be promoted to the next Semester irrespective of her result in Semester-I & III provided that she has registered for the examination by filling the Examination Form.
2. A student is eligible to be promoted to Semester-III only if she obtains 50% of the total credits allotted in Semester-I & Semester-II taken together.
3. A student is eligible to be promoted to Semester-V only if she obtains 75% of total credits allotted in Semester-I to Semester-IV taken together.
4. A student is eligible to be promoted to Semester-VI only if she earns all the credits from Semester-I to Semester -V.
5. If a student is not eligible for Semester-III, V, VI she has to appear in the subsequent Due Examination as an Ex-Student so as to qualify. After fulfilling the necessary criteria for promotion, such students shall be readmitted and promoted to the next semester and follow the prevalent Semester course being run in the College.
6. A student will be eligible to get her Degree only if she earns all the credits from Semester-I to Semester-VI (Degree will be issued by MDS, University, Ajmer as per their norms)

VI Promotion Policy for PG Programmes:

1. A student of Semester-I shall automatically be promoted to Semester-II irrespective of her result in Semester-I provided that she has registered for the examination by filling the Examination Form.

2. A student is eligible to be promoted to Semester-III only if she obtains 50% of the total credits allotted in Semester-I & Semester-II taken together.
3. A student is eligible to be promoted to Semester-IV only if she earns all the credits from Semester-I to Semester-III.
4. If a student is not eligible for Semester-III or IV, she has to appear in the subsequent Due Examination as an Ex-Student so as to qualify. After fulfilling the necessary criteria for promotion, such students shall be readmitted and promoted to the next semester and follow the prevalent Semester course being run in the College.
5. A student will be eligible to get her Degree only if she earns all the credits from Semester-I to Semester-IV (Degree will be issued by MDS, University, Ajmer as per their norms)

VII Due Papers:

1. If a student fulfils the minimum passing criteria in any semester, she will be eligible for Next Semester and the papers in which she has failed would be treated as 'Due Papers'. The candidate is required to appear in the due papers as and when they are held.
2. A student is eligible to appear for the Due Paper provided that she has registered for the Due Examination by filling the Examination Form.
3. In case of due papers, the candidate is examined in the ESE only and the CIA marks obtained by her in the earlier semester(s) will be taken into account.

VIII Provision for unsuccessful candidates:

1. A candidate who is not eligible for promotion to the III / IV / V/ VI Semester, as the case may be, will be allowed to appear in subsequent examinations as an ex-student so as to qualify more papers in the immediately following year. After fulfilling the necessary criteria for promotion, such students

would be re-admitted and promoted to the next semester, as and when the relevant semester course is being run at the college.

IX Rules for Revaluation:

1. A candidate whose result of the main examination has been declared may apply to the Controller of Examination for revaluation of her answer books (only theory examination) in the form prescribed by the college within 5 days from the date of declaration of online results with the prescribed fees
2. A student shall not be allowed to do revaluation in more than 50% of the number of the papers. No revaluation shall be allowed in case of practical, fieldwork, seminar, sessional work, life skill courses, ability enhancement courses, skill enhancement courses, generic elective courses, continuous internal assessment test, thesis / dissertation, project report submitted at the time of examination. When the result of a candidate is withheld for non compliance of certain conditions on her part (i.e. non submission of migration certificate, original documents, case of unfair means etc) the time limit for accepting her form would not be extended on this account, i.e. it would be within 5 days after the declaration of online results. Revaluation is also not allowed for Due Paper.
3. The fee for revaluation is charged per paper which is not refundable, provided that if the revaluation has not been done due to unavoidable circumstances, the full amount (except processing charges) of fees paid for revaluation will be refunded for each answer book.
4. The answer books are preserved for 6 months after the results are declared as per the exam rules. No claim will be entertained after the prescribed period.
5. The result of revaluation shall be communicated to the candidate even if there is no change in marks.

X Grading System:

The students are evaluated on the basis of Continuous Internal Assessment and the End Semester Examinations. For the grading and classification of students, the performance of the students is first marked according to the conventional procedure. Marks are then converted into grades and grades in turn into grade points in accordance with ten point grading system using the following table
